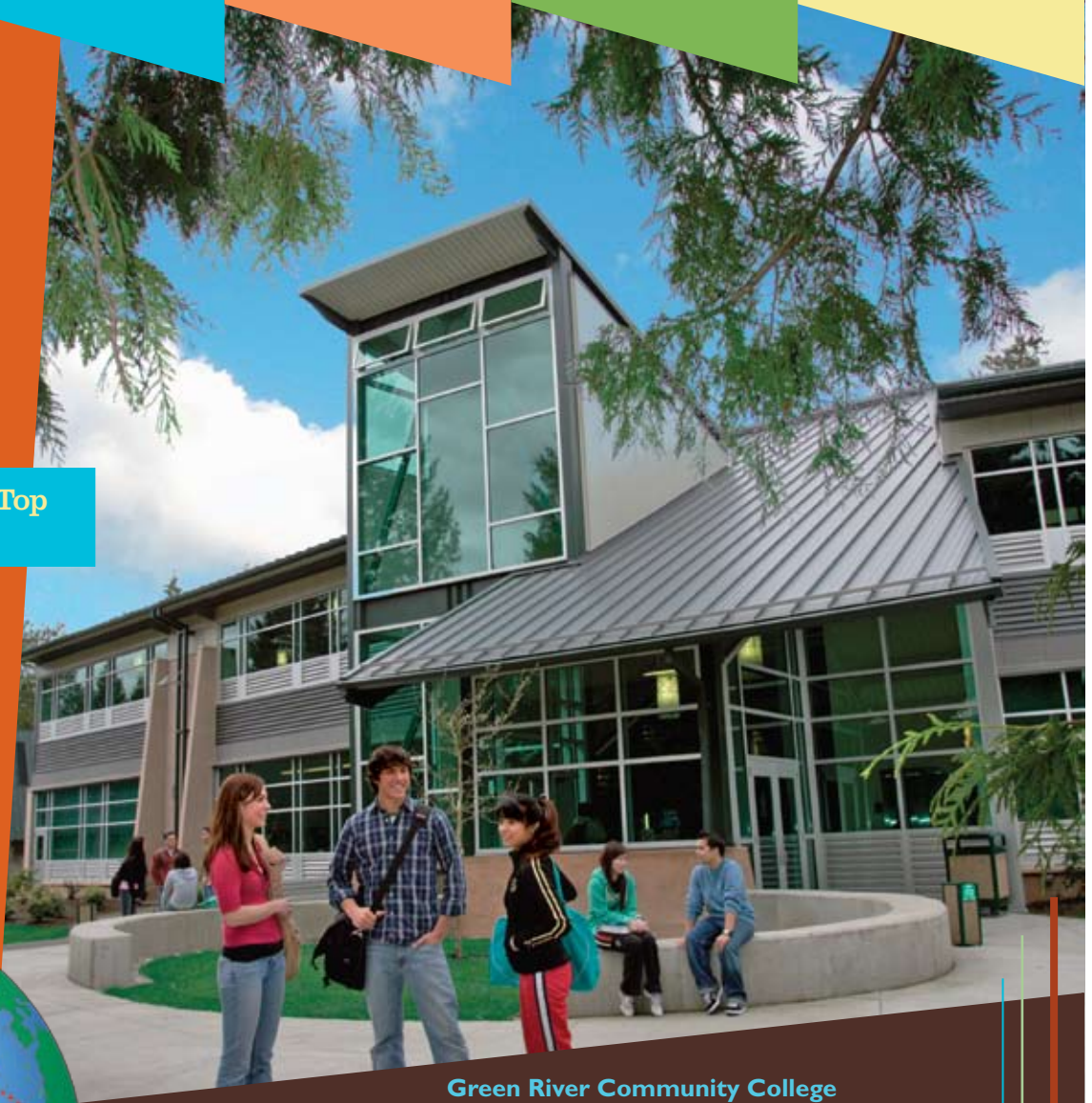

University Transfer

Students take the first two years* of their bachelor's degree at Green River. With their academic advisor, students develop a personal transfer plan and take a combination of general education and introductory classes in their major.

The Conditional Guaranteed Admission program allows applicants to request a conditional acceptance letter from a U.S. university listed on our website.

**Depending on assessment and placement, students may need to take non-transferable, developmental classes and the program may take longer.*

Degrees and Certificates

Two-year Associate in Arts, Associate in Science and Associate in Business degrees, as well as shorter certificates can be taken alone or added to a university transfer program. Programs include: Aviation, Broadcasting, International Business, Speech, and more than 30 others.

Intensive English

The Intensive ESL Program (IESL) provides strong academic English preparation for students entering a college or university.

- 20 hours per week (summer varies)
- Grammar, Writing, Reading, Oral and TOEFL preparation
- Five levels: basic to academic preparation
- Bridge Program: IESL + academic class (TOEFL 450)

Graduates of the IESL program qualify to take academic classes without TOEFL.

High School Plus

Earn a Washington state high school diploma and a university transfer degree in two years* using the same classes for both.

Scholarships

Many scholarships are available to new students and are awarded as partial tuition waivers or campus work grants ranging from \$250 to \$5,000+, dependent on the type of award.

Admission Requirements

- Completed International Student Application
- Financial statement
- \$50 non-refundable application fee
- Applicants must be at least 16 years old
- Housing Selection and Fees as applicable
 - \$300 placement fee for Campus Corner Apartments, Homestay or Homeshare
- Transcript from last school attended, sealed by school (recommended)

TOEFL/IELTS Requirements

TOEFL 45/133/450 = Admission to Bridge
 TOEFL 61/173/500, IELTS 5.5, no band lower than 4.5 = Admission to Academic
 No TOEFL or IELTS for placement in IESL

- Prices effective fall 2009–summer 2010 and subject to change.
- Full-time fees for IESL Program are \$2779. The Bridge Program is an additional \$200 per quarter.
- Health insurance is required and is available through the college for a fee of \$186 per quarter.
- Book cost varies by program
- Fees include a \$60 technology, \$35 facilities, \$9 special services, and \$25 Student Center Replacement fee.

Spring: March–June 2010

 Testing/Orientation begins March 23, 2010

 Testing/Orientation begins June 17, 2010
 Classes start June 21, 2010

The preferred application deadline is one month before orientation. Apply early to allow for visa processing (up to two months for certain countries and housing placement.)
 Students in the U.S. can apply up to the date classes start.
