Green River Community College international students have been admitted to hundreds of universities all over the US. Students gain the qualifications needed for admission at Green River Community College and transfer to top universities as third year juniors. Admission is not guaranteed, but our students have been very successful in gaining admission to top universities.

The following universities have offered conditional guaranteed admission to any student who is admitted to Green River. The guarantee does not apply to “impacted” majors. This is how it works:

1. Apply to GRCC – Apply online (www.greenriver.edu/international) or on paper.
2. Select a university – The student chooses the university from which he or she wishes conditional guaranteed admission. Choose one university only. A list of majors is on back. The choices:

4. Receive the university letter with GRCC admission – GRCC will include a conditional guaranteed admission letter from the university with the GRCC admission letter and GRCC I-20.

Frequently asked questions:

Q – Will a conditional guaranteed admission letter help me get a US student visa?

A – The main purpose of the program is to help you plan your academic program in the US. You should be familiar with both GRCC and the university when you apply for a visa. Visas cannot be guaranteed.

Q – Do I have to transfer to the university which issues me the letter?

A – No. You can transfer anywhere you want.

Q – Will the university issuing the letter contact me?

A – Yes. GRCC will give your name and contact information to the university.

Notes:

1. Conditions of admission – Each cooperating university issues its own admissions letter with its conditions clearly outlined therein. The conditions of admission indicated in the letters can change without notice, and take precedence over the information contained in this chart.
2. Transferable credits – These refer to college-level courses which generally transfer to universities. Most but not all academic classes numbered 100 or higher transfer. Read 104 and Engl 100 are two commonly-taken GRCC courses numbered 100 or higher that do not transfer. Classes numbered lower than 100 are considered developmental courses and do not transfer. Most college students can earn 90 transferable quarters in two years, although they may need a summer quarter to do so.
3. Associate – This can mean Associate in Business Administration, Associate of Arts or Associate in Science.
4. English composition courses – Engl& 101 and one of English 126, 127 or 128, two classes in total, are the standard freshman and sophomore composition classes required by all US colleges and universities. They were recently renamed from Engl 110, and Engl 111, 112 or 113 respectively. English 126 is writing for humanities, 127 writing for social sciences, and 128 for science/engineering/business. Most international students take Engl 128.
5. Minimum GRCC gpa – The minimum gpa required to earn a GRCC Associate degree is 2.0. Most international students do far better. As of Spring 2009, the median international student gpa at GRCC was 3.50.
