Looking for Funding for College?

Explore theWashBoard.org, the Washington Scholarship Coalition's free scholarship search engine available to Washington state residents or students who are currently enrolled in Washington colleges.

It simplifies the search by leading you directly to scholarships that are specific to your academic interests, college or university and allows you to apply directly from the site.

Another unique advantage you will have with this search tool is that it coordinates with other online tools to promote college readiness and planning.

Scholarships found on theWashBoard.org may also be used for colleges outside the state unless otherwise specified.

Benefits of theWashboard.org

- Students are less vulnerable to predatory lending, keeping risk and loan defaults low.
- Through the financial support of scholarships, more students will achieve their educational goals no matter their income needs, academic abilities or major.
- The 62 percent of Washington's higher education students who do not fit the "traditional" scholarship profile will be better served.

Scholarship search tips:

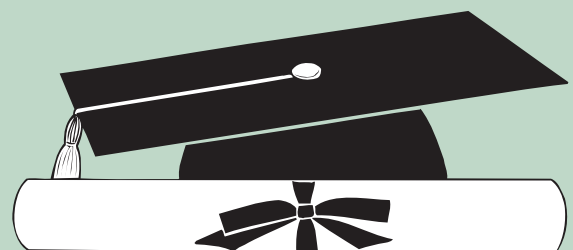
- Start your search early to get an idea of what types of scholarships are available.
- If a fee is required or they ask for a credit card, disregard it. There are enough scholarships available that don't require a fee.
- Research opening and closing dates and submit your application early.
- Keep a personal portfolio and a copy of all scholarships for which you have applied.

Questions to ask university representatives

- 1 Who is the contact person for transfer students at your school?**
- 2 When should I apply for admission?**
- 3 Does your school offer the major I'm interested in?**
- 4 When should I apply for my intended major?**
- 5 What are the required courses for my intended major?**
- 6 What is the average GPA for transfer students for my intended major?**

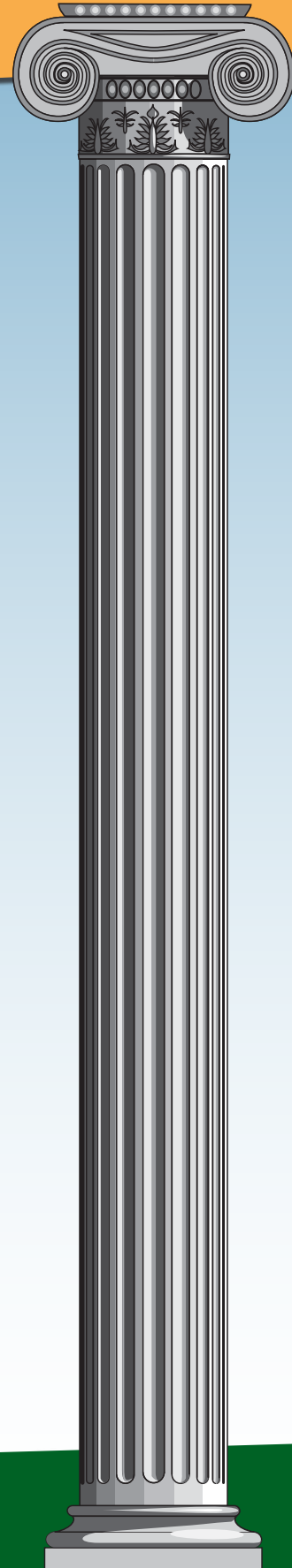
