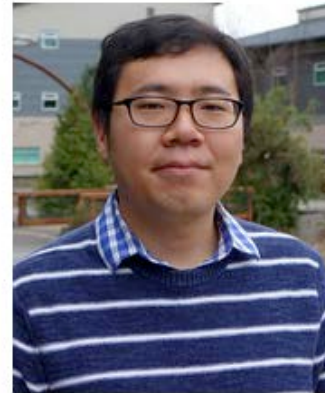

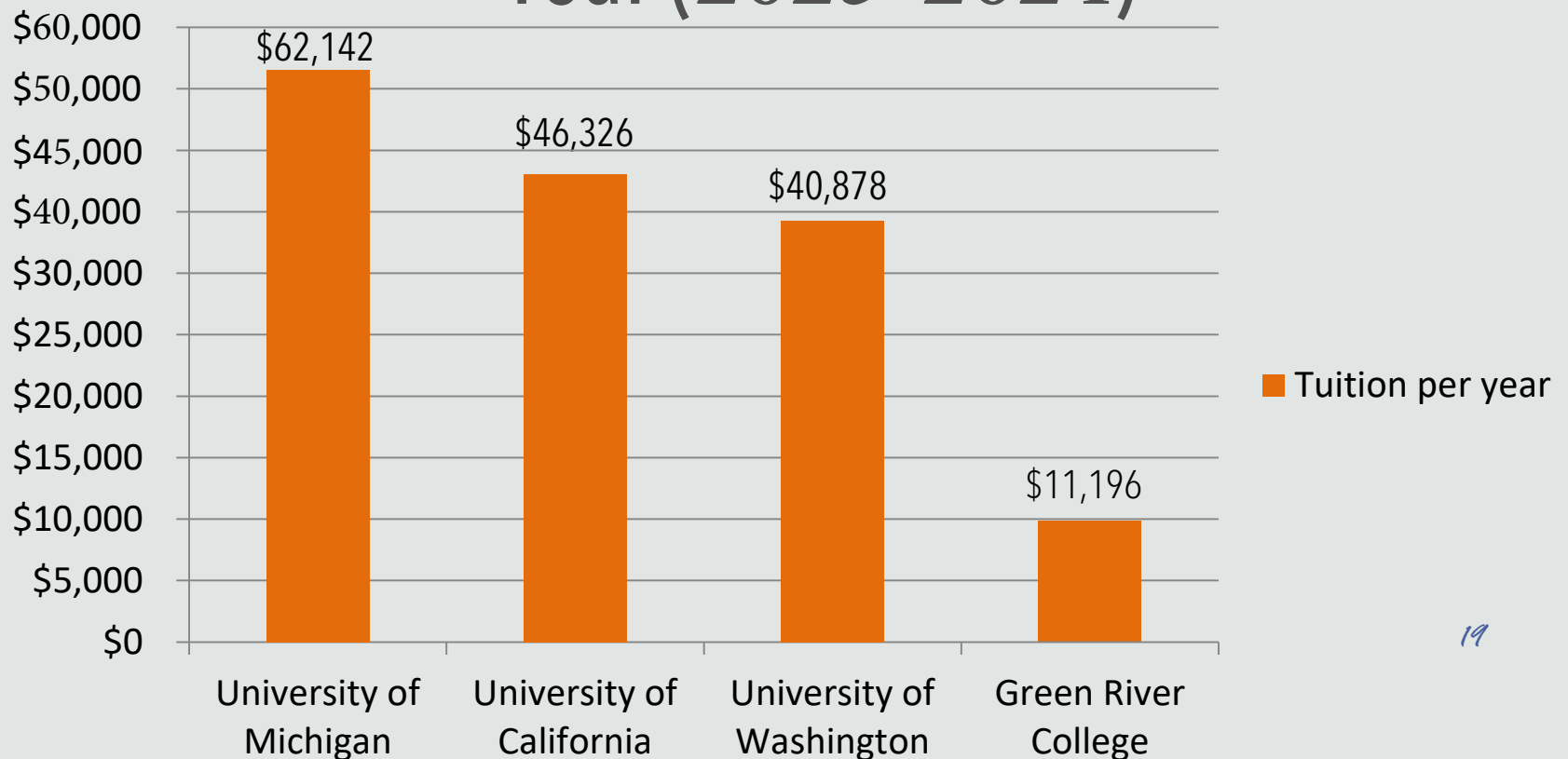

High School Completion

High School Diploma can help students get into top universities

- ❑ Take college classes and receive credit for both the Green River Associate's Degree and Washington State High School Diploma*
- ❑ Required courses for the High School diploma include US History, American Government, and English
- ❑ Length of time to earn diploma varies depending on transcript evaluation and placement testing
- ❑ HSC Program for students who do not already have a high school diploma

*Depending on assessment and placement, student may need to take non-transferable, pre-college level classes first.

College Experience

- Required of all new students who have English proficiency and will be attending academic classes at Green River
- Class is three hours per week and is in addition to student's regular academic class schedule
- Class is held the first five weeks of the quarter and will be scheduled the first or second quarter the student is at Green River

Housing Options

On Campus Housing



Host Family



Host Family

- \$825 per month (17+)
- \$950 per month (16 yrs)
- Private room
- American style meals (3 meals per day)
- Airport pickup
- Area orientation
- Campus visit
- Assistance with banking



On-Campus Housing Campus Corner Apartments

- ❑ Approx. \$973.00 per month
- ❑ Students have airport meet and greet service, area orientation and assistance with shopping, banking needs, etc.
- ❑ Each unit has four bedrooms, two bathrooms, a kitchen and central living and dining areas
- ❑ Each student has private bedroom
- ❑ Rooms are fully furnished and have high-speed internet access, cable television and telephone hook-ups included in rent
- ❑ Includes all utilities



Campus Corner Apartments

- ❑ Students prepare own meals
- ❑ Move-in kits provided to new residents include Bedding, Pillow, Bath Towel, and Snacks
- ❑ Central laundry facility and Community Room with big screen television, kitchen and lounge area
- ❑ 24-hour security and resident advisors on site
- ❑ Different lease options are available



Housing Placement

- Completed Housing Application
- \$300 Housing Placement Fee includes the following:
 - Airport greeting and pick-up and transportation service
 - Move-in kit for CCA students (sheets, pillow, towels, etc.)
 - For homestay students: \$100 credited toward first month's rent
 - Area orientation and local contact
- Students are placed in housing when completed application and Housing Placement Fee are submitted
- Refund policy: \$300 placement fee refundable upon request if student cancels application two weeks prior to housing/move-in day

Please note all students the age of 16 at move-in date will be required to live in our housing program (Host Family) until they are 17 years old. Green River College recommends underage students to remain in Green River housing.

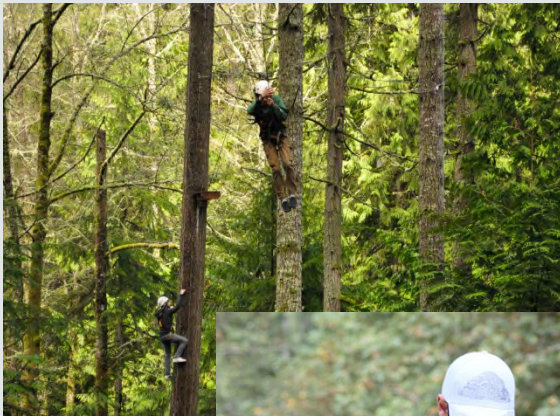

- Preferred Application Deadline - February 1st
