This change is in order to meet the requirements of Chapter 5 page 5-2 of the 2016 Handbook for Campus Safety and Security Reporting published by the US Department of Education, specifically " "The purpose of the daily crime log is to record all criminal incidents and alleged criminal incidents that are reported to the campus police or security department." All other aspects of the Daily Crime Log remain the same.	
As of 07-12-2017 the Green River College Campus Safety Department will only post incidents related to Auto Accidents which are criminal in nature . All other aspects of the Daily Crime Log remain the same.	
Effective 01-01-2025, Hazing is now a Clery-reportable crime that must be disclosed in the annual crime statistics. Additionally, the Stop Campus Hazing Act requires inclusion of policy statements in the Annual Security Report that address the institution's Hazing policies as well as information regarding the prevention and awareness programs related to Hazing that institutions must offer. The law also requires creation and disclosure of a <i>Campus Hazing Transparency Report</i> , and the law renames the Clery Act from the "Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act" to the "Jeanne Clery Campus Safety Act."
