

## **Income Tax Filing for International Students**

If an international student worked and received income in <u>2016</u> they will need to file a U.S. income tax return and may be eligible to receive tax refunds. <u>Deadline for filing your tax returns is April 18, 2017</u>

The GRC International Programs Office is not responsible for you filing your taxes and we do not have the training or legal authority to provide assistance or advice in regards to filing taxes.

Which forms to fill out? If you <u>worked</u> in the U.S. and <u>have received income in 2016</u> – <u>Form 8843</u> and <u>Form 1040 NR-EZ</u> (with no dependents) or <u>1040-NR</u> (with dependents). You most likely will receive a W-2, a 1042-S, or a 1099 form.

(F-1 students who have been here less than 5 years are considered nonresident aliens for tax purposes)
