Course Outline

Responsive Web Design

Skilled web designers are adept at crafting sites to provide an optimal viewing experience. As the user switches from computer to tablet to phone, the website should automatically adjust to accommodate for screen size, resolution and scripting abilities. In this course, learn how the combination of flexible grids, layouts, images and the intelligent use of CSS media queries create easy reading and navigation for the end user.

Who Should Take This Course?

This course is designed for those who want to create websites with optimal viewing experiences. Students should have a foundational understanding of HTML and CSS. This is the third required course in the User Experience (UX) Design Certificate Program.

Course Objectives

Course Content

Demonstrate how mobile considerations impact your desktop design, and how your content will impact both

- Define "device agnostic design", and explain why it is important
- Identify the ideal line-length for screen readability

Apply CSS to create flexible layouts for any screen size

- Use appropriate viewport code for cross-browser support
- Use a grid to create a flexible multi-column layout
- Use a grid to create a multi-column layout
- Apply the target/context = result formula to set proportional widths on layout elements
