# Photoshop CC

Photoshop is an industry standard tool for graphic designers, web designers and photographers. In this hands-on course, you will learn how to enhance, modify and improve photographs. Topics include using the Photoshop interface, including panels, options and personal customization; effectively selecting, correcting and layering your compositions; retouching and correcting images; improving photos with color corrections and image adjustments; and practicing tips, tricks and shortcuts to increase your Photoshop efficiency.

## Who Should Take This Course?

This course is designed for individuals with no prior knowledge of Photoshop who wish to learn how to utilize the tools and functionality of this software to create or enhance images. This is the second required course in the Graphic Design Certificate.
