CONDITIONS OF AWARD AND STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES

- I must enroll in a program of study that leads to an approved degree or certificate at Green River College, and the classes that I take must be required for my program at Green River College. I cannot use financial aid for high school completion.
- I must maintain satisfactory academic progress in order to obtain and continue financial aid funding. This policy is explained in a separate brochure.
- I can be considered for financial aid for the *equivalent* of 125% of the credits that my program requires. Remedial coursework needed to reach program-required classes is counted toward maximum timeframe limits. Eligibility for remedial coursework is limited to 45 attempted credits.
- I must notify the Financial Aid Office each quarter that I plan to enroll in less than 12 credits, including Summer quarter. Financial Aid will be adjusted down to my enrollment level. When enrolling in less than six credits, I will lose eligibility for some funding sources, including student loans and work-study funding.
- I understand that my enrollment level is checked on the tenth business day of the quarter (census date) and earlier in summer. I will owe an immediate repayment of Financial Aid funds if I drop to a lower enrollment level on or before the census date.
- I understand that I am responsible to repay any overpayment I owe due to inaccurate information
 provided or if funding was disbursed at another school on my behalf during overlapping enrollment
 period.
- I am responsible for repaying all or part of my grants, as well as any federal tuition refund in excess of the college's own refund policy, should I withdraw from classes during the quarter.
- I understand that if awarded Work-Study, a job is not guaranteed. Students must attend Work-Study orientation before they begin their job search.
- I must agree to use state or federal financial aid funds for educational expenses related to my attendance at Green River College (tuition, fees, books and supplies, room and board, personal expenses, computer, child care and transportation--excluding the purchase of a car).
- I recognize that Green River College reserves the right to adjust my financial aid because of changes in state or federal funding. A financial aid award does not imply a commitment on the part of the college to continue assistance beyond the time period stated in the offer notification.
- I will notify the Financial Aid Office of any changes in my name, address, marital status, or if I receive any other type of funding outside of the college such as scholarships, agency funding, etc.
- I must meet academic progress requirements, reapply for financial aid each year and submit all requested documents on or before the priority date for continuous eligibility.
