Graphic Design Certificate Capstone

Prove your capability to create professional pieces of art in this final capstone course. With your instructor's guidance, you will utilize Photoshop, Illustrator and InDesign to build a portfolio reflecting the knowledge and skills gained throughout the Graphic Design Certificate Program. This portfolio will be helpful as you seek a career in Graphic Design.

Who Should Take This Course?

This is the final course in the Graphic Design Certificate Program. Enrollment is limited to certificate students who have successfully completed all required courses.

- Combine the use of Photoshop, Illustrator and InDesign to create portfolio materials.

Session 1:

Benchmark 1: Focus on Illustrator

Topics:

- Receive client logo sheets and provide analysis of client needs.
 - Create logo case study (sketch)
 - Select colors
 - Develop digital logo using Illustrator
 - Produce branding guide from developed logo.
- Deliverable for this class
 - Sketches
 - Digital Logo
 - Branding Guide
 - Added to your presentation materials

Session 2

Bench Mark 2: Focus on Photoshop

Topics:

- Receive marketing photos in need of editing in Photoshop.
 - Identify appropriate methods for correction.
 - Adjust colors to improve photos
 - Remove backgrounds behind subjects
 - Create composite
 - Deliverable for this class
 - Collection of photos modified with Photoshop to be used for marketing purposes.
 - Added to your presentation materials.

Bench Mark 3: Focus on InDesign

Topics:

- Receive instructions on using templates to create marketing collateral
 - Develop marketing collateral from scratch and with supplied templates
- Deliverable for this class
 - Marketing collateral to be added to presentation materials.

Assessment /Evaluation

Course Completion/Continuing Education Unit (CEU) Letter

Please note: Saturday courses lasting longer than four hours will count as two sessions.
