Overview of Common Nursing & Healthcare Roles

Assistant/Technician: Narrow scope of work. Provides basic patient care under supervision, assisting with daily activities and monitoring health. Examples include nursing assistant, emergency room technician, and phlebotomist. Licensing typically requires completion of a certificate program.

Practical Nurse (PN): Delivers direct patient care under supervision, focusing on hands-on skills and patient interaction. Licensing requires completion of an Associate of Applied Science in Practical Nursing degree.

Registered Nurse (RN): Coordinates patient care, administers medications, educates patients, and collaborates with healthcare providers. Licensing requires completion of an Associates Degree in Nursing or an Bachelors of Science in Nursing degree.

Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist (CRNA): Administers anesthesia and monitors patients during surgery for safe pain management. Licensing requires completion of a CRNA program. Admission into a CRNA program typically requires 1-3 years of experience as an RN working in the ICU at a level 1 or 2 trauma hospital, like Harborview.

Nurse Practitioner (NP): Diagnoses and treats illnesses, prescribes medications, and educates patients, often specializing in specific areas. Licensing requires completion of a masters or doctoral program.

Nursing Specialties

Once an individual achieves nursing licensure, specialization often occurs through on-the-job training, experience, and further education, such as advanced practice nursing programs like a Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) or a Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP), offering specialized coursework and clinical experiences.

Funding

Students may qualify for funding for both certificate and degree programs. Degrees are eligible for FAFSA, WASFA, Workforce Grants, and Foundation Scholarships. Most certificates are only funded through the Workforce Office, except the Emergency Room & Patient Care Technician program, which also qualifies for FAFSA and WASFA.

Green River Certificate Pathways

Green River offers three certificate programs designed to prepare students for specific roles within healthcare. Each program provides the training required to meet State licensure standards and develop the skills necessary for role competency. Upon graduation, students are prepared to enter the workforce and are considered job-ready once they have successfully completed any required licensure examinations and submitted their applications for licensure.

Certificate Program Requirements

In order to participate in Green River College's Nursing & Healthcare Studies certificate programs, students must meet the following requirements.

English Proficiency

- Students must qualify for English Level TS 6.
- Students who place into ENGL 97 or higher qualify for TS Level 6.
- Students who take the College Success reading assessment must score 61 or higher.

Background Check

- Students must pass a background check.
- · Students with criminal convictions may not be eligible to participate in Green River's Nursing & Healthcare Studies programs.
- · Check with the program manager if you have questions about how a background check may affect your ability to participate.

Age Requirement

- Students must be 18 years of age within three months of program graduation.
- The State requires students to be 18 years of age at the time of licensure.
- · Students may be 17 while in the program but must turn 18 within three months of graduation to ensure retention of skills for licensure.

Drug Screening

- Students must be able to pass a drug screening.
- · Drug tests are required by some, but not all, clinical facilities. Students will only need to submit to a drug test if required by the clinical site.
- · Drug tests typically include marijuana, which remains illegal at the federal level.

Emergency Room & Patient Care Technician | Average Wage: \$48,853 | 8.8% Projected Growth

Common Job Duties: Measure vital signs, assist with daily activities, document care, provide support, perform assessments, assist in trauma care including wound care and splinting, help with medical procedures, and prioritize patient care.

Green River offers an AAS in Practical Nursing and a BSN for LPNs, with part-time and full-time options. Graduates may apply for PN or RN licensure.

Completion of this program does not qualify students for licensure in nursing.

Participants in all of Green River's Nursing programs, except for Phlebotomy, must complete all required immunizations and medical tests. No exemptions are allowed. A titer, as mentioned below, is a blood test used to check immunity to specific diseases.


